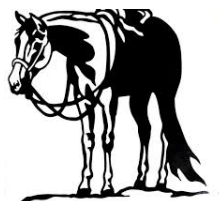
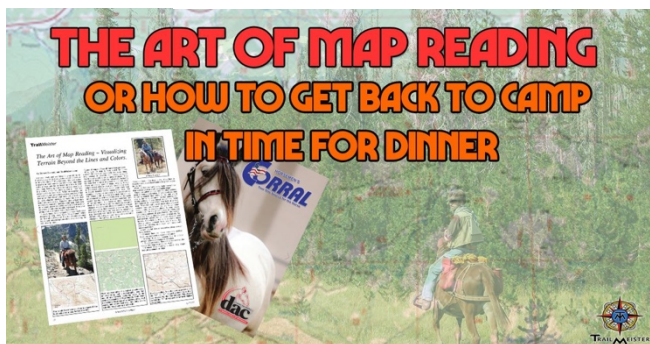

The ABC's of Trail Riding



**I** is for Insects – Some will tell aspiring trail riders to fear the bears, cougars, and wolves; Oh my! But you're far more likely to have an unpleasant encounter with bees on a trail ride.



Bees are industrious creatures and are quick to press an attack if they feel their home has been threatened. Be prepared to take swift action if you run into these creatures on a ride. The encounter won't be fun but keeping calm should help prevent worse consequences. Ask riding partners about allergies - BEFORE the ride.
